Michael Niebel is Adviser for Internet Policy and Technology at the European Commission. He has been heading the Internet Policy Development Task Force that prepared the 2014 Commission Communication on Internet Policy and Governance. In the context of the World Summit on the Information Society, he participated in the preparatory work and the negotiations leading to the Tunis Agenda. Michael has been joining global multistakeholder exchanges at the Internet Governance Forum meetings since the first IGF in Athens. In the preparation of and during the Global Multistakeholder Meeting on the Future of Internet Governance he worked in the Executive Multistakeholder Committee of NETmundial.

At the end of the 1990's, Michael was involved in the definition of the European position during the process leading to the creation of ICANN. For 7 years he was member of ICANN's Governmental Advisory Committee. In 2013/14 he served in the Expert Working Group on gTLD Directory Services.

Michael has been responsible for Network and Information Security Policy and the establishment of the European Network and Information Security Agency (ENISA). He was also in charge of setting up process and framework for the introduction of the .eu top-level domain.

Past activities include telecommunication liberalisation, audiovisual and media, data protection as well as intellectual property.
